
School Trips

Important messages!

- When it is your Childs birthday please do not ask school adults to hand out party bags, cakes or sweets as we will not be able to do this.
- Parent Fines for Missing School Fines will be considered when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons. From August 2024, the fine for school absences will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160.

School Streets

In 2020, a School Street initiative was introduced outside Elm Wood Primary School, successfully reducing motor vehicle traffic during pick-up and drop-off times. This has significantly improved safety for children.

However, some vehicles continue to drive dangerously outside school during School Street times, putting children at risk. To address these concerns, Lambeth Council is exploring additional measures to enhance safety on Carnac Street. The aim is to create an environment where children, parents/carers and residents can feel safe and enjoy their surroundings.







Lambeth Council have come to school to meet with our two young leader teams (School Council & Eco Team). This was a productive session and Lambeth seemed really impressed by the quality of the feedback they received. Children were asked what they wanted to see on the local streets around Elm Wood School & they were encouraged to be as creative as possible. The children represented the school beautifully! Well done to all our Young Leaders!

Lambeth visited school on 13.02.25 to attend a whole school assembly where key information was shared with all children.

We are all looking forward to seeing how this project continues to develop!

Parent Survey

Thank you for taking the time to complete the recent parent survey.

Parent surveys are a great way for us as a school to have feedback. Feedback from surveys can be used to make necessary changes that can improve the school overall for both students and parents.

There were some common themes highlighted in the feedback.

- Targets: Some parents stated that their children are not aware of their targets for Reading, Writing and Maths.
 Targets will be shared with parents at parents evening and school is putting actions in place to ensure that the children are all aware of their targets and how to meet them.
- Assemblies: Some parents stated that they would like to hear more from the Class Teachers during Workshare Assemblies. We have already actioned this and Class Teachers are now introducing their class assemblies so that they can showcase the learning that has taken place in their classes.
- Curriculum: Some parents stated that they were unsure of how some of the curriculum areas are being delivered across the school. Parents spoke about Art in particular. In response to this there is a Parent Event taking place on 14.02.25 which provides parents with a currriculum update and the opportunity to see how all subjects are covered across the school.

The school also received lots of positive comments linked to the strengths of the school. I have captured some of these below:

This school is extremely caring. This is reflected in the way teachers speak to pupils and parents, and in turn is reflected in their learning.

All teachers and staff members are very supportive and caring towards the children and listen to the children. Feels more like a family than just a school.

The opportunities to apply what they have learnt in the classroom on school trips, really relevant and applies to the real world. My child is coming home and talking about what they have learnt and are able to recall what they have covered.
